Update on Humber Coast and Vale Sustainability and Transformation Partnership

Partners across Humber, Coast and Vale have come together to develop the STP as a health and care system that has the will and ability to help its population start well. The Sustainability and Transformation Plan published in November set out the priorities to take this forward.

Since then partners have continued to work together to take forward the aspirations set out. Some of this work is taking place at a Humber Coast and Vale level and some at a Place level (ie North Lincolnshire).

Governance and support

To support the STP a Strategic Partnership Board has been established with membership from all partners. This is now meeting bi-monthly. The CCG is represented by Liane Langdon.

This is supported by an STP Executive Group meeting monthly that brings together the Senior Responsible Officers (SRO's) for each of the work streams. Liane Langdon is the SRO for North Lincolnshire Place delivery and attends.

The North and North East Lincolnshire Programme Management office has been established to support both areas in taking forward the aspirations of the STP locally. Caroline Briggs is the Transformation Programme Director. This has replaced what was previously the Healthy Lives Healthy Futures office (HLHF). The work we had to done through HLHF to change our health and care services is now being taken forward through the STP and Place (North Lincolnshire and North East Lincolnshire) delivery and as such continuing to refer to HLHF was felt to be adding unnecessary confusion. Going forward we are reflecting 3 levels of work to support us locally.

- Humber Coast and Vale STP
- North and North East Lincolnshire STP
- North Lincolnshire STP

North Lincolnshire Update

Taking forward the STP within North Lincolnshire key areas include:

- Integrating health and care services and the development of an accountable care partnership with membership from Safecare Network, Northern Lincolnshire and Goole Foundation Trust, Rotherham, Doncaster and South Humber Foundation Trust and North Lincolnshire Council.
- Developing primary care and taking forward the implementation of the GP 5 Year Forward
 View
- Prevention, self-care and wellbeing working with all partners and the voluntary and community sector.

Recent Communication and Engagement activity

Health Matters 5 on the 1 March at the Baths Hall included an overview of the STP and information was available at a Market Stall

A stakeholder workshop with attendees from health and care partners and the voluntary and community sector was held on the 30 March at Arties Mill to help us develop our North Lincolnshire



Delivery Plans. The workshop was well attended with over 70 attendees from a wide range of organisations. The outcomes are currently being collated to share with all attendees and to consider how they help shape our delivery plans.
