Out of Hospital Update August 2018

1. Background

NLCCG Governing Body has been reviewing the community services it commissions from NLaG over the last year or two in light of the agreed vision for more services to be delivered out of hospital and closer to people's homes. A decision was taken at the Governing Body workshop held in June 2018 to work with our current providers, in partnership, to shape a new integrated out of hospital model.

The CCG therefore notified the current provider NLaG of the intentions and agreed to review in nine months' time (March 2019). Separate work is on-going with the Trust to monitor the current contract via the Contract Management Board and several meetings have been held with Directors of the two organisations to outline the work required during this review period.

It was agreed to establish a Transformation Board with all the system leaders represented to develop a strategy to oversee the development of the integrated model of out of hospital provision. Members represent the Council, CCG, NLaG, RDaSH, EMAS, Safecare and the voluntary sector.

2. Transformation Board Out of Hospital (TB)

The TB met for its inaugural meeting in July to set the scope and purpose of the group. The purpose of the group is:

- 1.1. To provide system leadership to shape and deliver an integrated model for out of hospital services for both adults and children
- 1.2. To prioritise the out of hospital model so that most people receive support, advice and guidance and services where needed as close to their home as possible.
- 1.3. To develop a sustainable strategy to move care out of the acute model and be provided out of hospital wherever possible.
- 1.4. To ensure that the integrated model supports both physical, emotional and mental health needs of adults and children
- 1.5. To work as a system to develop a model of out of hospital services (including physical and mental health needs) that takes account of future needs, is developed around the person and their needs, uses innovative technologies to provide a sustainable model. Its principal outcome will be to improve health and care services and the health and wellbeing of children, young people, adults and communities in North Lincolnshire.
- 1.6. The purpose of the Transformation Board (TB) is to develop a system response to an integrated out of hospital model where delivery of all non-acute work is via the Care Network model.
- 1.7. The TB will develop a model of integrated care that fits with the wider Health and social care Place Plan as part of the STP.
- 1.8. To monitor delivery against the agreed Transformation Plan and provide assurance that the agreed outcomes are being delivered.
- 1.9. To manage and resolve any issues escalated to the Board by the Working Group

The TB also approved the establishment of a Working Group to support the Transformation Programme delivery made up of representatives from all the stakeholders. Both groups will meet monthly initially.

The first meeting of the Working Group is in August 2018.

3. Next steps

The two groups will develop a Transformation Plan over the next month to prioritise the work to be undertaken and establish Task & Finish Groups where necessary. This work is being supported by the Programme Manager in NL CCG. Clinical leads from the different organisations are represented on both groups.

Contract management of the current community services contract will be via the Contract management Board.
