Chair's Report to the Governing Body

Quality, Performance and Finance Committee

Meetings held on 1st November and 6th December 2018

In accordance with the constitution, standing orders and Scheme of delegation, NLCCG has established the Quality, Performance and Finance committee. The purpose of the group is to ensure the continuing development of the monitoring and reporting of performance outcome metrics in relation to the CCG quality improvement, financial performance and management plans. The committee will ensure delivery of improved outcomes for patients in relation to the CCGs strategic objectives and continually aim to improve the quality of the services provided.

This report reflects a summary of the meetings held on 1st November and 6th December 2018 and the agreed action points.

Finance	
1 st November 2018 and	The Committee were pleased to note that performance against the QUIPP position within both months shows improvement, and that the Medicines Optimisation QUIPP has already been met.
6 th December 2018	The committee felt the current financial position was positive and risks identified would continue to be monitored The Committee were pleased to note that the forecast position remains as per plan.
Quality and Performa	nce
1 st November 2018	The Committee considered the performance data from a range of providers and undertook robust discussion in relation to the quality implications within the Integrated Quality Performance and Finance
and 6 th December 2018	Report (IQPF). The committee noted the changes within the report which now includes a clear quality section, with increasing evidence of a link between quality and performance.
	 Within the November meeting, the committee also noted a marked improvement in both the content and quality of a number of the reports presented (IQPF and Infection Prevention and Control), with assurance provided through the significant detail within the safeguarding report. The committee noted at the November meeting that further assurance was required in relation to Equality and Inclusion A robust discussion took place with regard to the purpose of the Procurement update during the November meeting, and Medicines Optimisation was discussed and duly noted the QUIPP achievement as recorded within the Finance section above. During the December meeting, the CCG sought and gained additional assurance within the Pain Management Service and Ophthalmology during the detailed discussion of the IQPF paper.

The Committee was provided with a comprehensive update on progress made by NLaG against the CQC action plan and assurance regarding the CCG's level of confidence in this regard.
The CCG is partially assured that the current systems and processes in place are sufficiently robust to gain assurance on progress and anticipate seeing an improvement in Q3 in this regard.
Within the December meeting, the Committee identified improvements in the quality and content of the Serious Incident and Incident reports providing an increased level of assurance.
Following concerns raised at the October Governing Body meeting, the Committee received an assurance report in relation to the Fractured Neck of Femur Pathway.
Fuel Disruption and Shortage Plan was approved following minor changes.
