NHS North Lincolnshire CCG and North Lincolnshire Council Partnership arrangements in respect of Adults and Older People

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In March 2009 NHS North Lincolnshire Board and North Lincolnshire Council North Lincolnshire reviewed partnership arrangements and agreed a new structure to extend integrated working and joined up commissioning to other adult services (specifically older people and people with disabilities); increase the level of service user and carer involvement with the establishment of citizen specific partnerships and to link more closely with the then local strategic partnership ambitions. This included updating and re-signing a section 75 partnership agreement under the National Health Services Act 2006 specifically to ensure the services for people with learning disabilities and mental health needs work together through integrated structures and pooled budgets. These were agreed by NHS North Lincolnshire Trust Board and North Lincolnshire Council Cabinet in March 2009 and have operated from April 2009.

In light of the establishment of NHS North Lincolnshire CCG, the Health and Well Being Board and changes to the management structure in North Lincolnshire Council to form the responsibilities of the Director of People, these arrangements need to be reviewed to ensure they meet future governance requirements.

The section 75 agreement specifically relates to Learning Disability and Mental Health Services and establishes lead commissioning and pooled budget arrangements. Under the agreement NHS North Lincolnshire is lead commissioner and pooled budget holder in relation to Mental Health services and North Lincolnshire Council is lead commissioner and pooled budget holder for Learning disability services.

Current Governance Arrangements

The Well-being and Health Improvement Partnership (WHIP) hold responsibility for overseeing the section 75 agreement. This is supported along with broader partnership working across all client groups by an Executive Strategic Commissioning Board and five Citizen Specific Expert reference partnerships.

The role of the WHIP is set out in the Partnership Agreement to provide leadership ambitions for the well-being and health of the local population; to advise the wider LSP on commissioning priorities for improved health; to ensure good outcomes are being delivered to hold the statutory responsibility for financial governance and to hold the Executive Strategic Commissioning Board to account.

The role of the Executive Strategic Commissioning Board is to ensure joined up commissioning for vulnerable adults; to provide leadership to the commissioning services in each agency; to manage the delegated budgets and to ensure robust partnerships arrangements exist to deliver effective outcomes to vulnerable adults.

The role of the citizen specific partnerships will be to engage with each client group and their families. To articulate for the commissioning board that citizen group's vision for their lives in North Lincolnshire and what their needs are and to establish out come based action plans to improve the life experience of people in the area.

In addition during 2010/11 a Section 256 agreement was entered into between the Local Authority and the PCT to allow the PCT to transfer resource to the Local Authority to be spent for the purpose outlined in the agreement. Additional resource was added to the agreement in 2011/12. This agreement gives responsibility to the ESCB to manage the section 256 agreement.

Future proposed arrangements

The Health and Wellbeing Board to hold responsibility for the section 75 and 256 agreements and to delegate management of both to the ESCB

ESCB to report to the HWB

Citizen Specific Partnerships to report to the HWB
